To measure float bed. fertifizer reading is first taken from the water-source that was used to fill bed (Generally, city water will read 3 and some wells or springs may read higher. The initial DIST 4 water reading is subtracted from the water bed reading. For instance, a 3 reading from water source subtracted could be compared to the control of the
