Burton and most of the other Roush drivers had been frustrated by their inability to wim a race. There were even rumors that Burton might go over to the Richard Childrens stean after this season.

But Burton took, the lead for the last time on lap 340 of the 400-lap race, which at 600 miles is the long-est event of the season, and was never seriously challenged.
