Somerset Technical College recently awarded two Governor's Kentucky Technical College Scholarships at a luncheon held in their honor. The scholarship is an award given by the Governor to provide assistance for

selected Kentucky high school senior recipients to enter or continue in postsecondary technical education in the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS). The award is based upon academic

achievement, character excellence and career potential. This year's recipients are Jeremy Alan Wilson of Somerset and Jamie A. McFerron of Mt. Vernon.

Jamie A. McFerron, daughter of Michael McFerron, will major in Graphic Technology seeking the Associate of Applied Science in General Occupational/Technical Studies Degree. She graduated in May from Rockcastle County High School. She also attended the Rockcastle County Area Technology Center where she centered her courses around the Business and Desktop Publishing career clusters. The luncheon was attended by the recipients; their parents; Dr. Carol Ann VanHook, STC Director; Kay Spillman, Scholarship Chair; Steve Philippi, Public Relation Director; and Stuart Simpson and Mike Dixon faculty members.

Dr. Carol Ann VanHook, STC Director, who presented the scholarships to the recipients noted that, "Somerset Technical College was extremely proud to receive students of this caliber. The competition is rigid and these two individuals represent the best of the best in their former high school. They are the future of our country's technical workforce."

The Governor's Kentucky Technical Scholarship is a full scholarship for study in a degree or diploma program at Somerset Technical College and includes all tuition and required fees, equipment (tools), books, supplies, personal safety gear and uniforms. The Governor's Kentucky Technical College Scholarship has an estimated value of \$3,000.

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AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY OF MT. VERNON, KENTUCKY ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2001 THOUGH UNE 30, 2002

Ord. #4-2001

Whereas, the legislative body has reviewed such budget proposal and modifications have been made, accordingly.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY the City of Mt. Vernon, Kentucky as follows:

SECTION ONE: That the annual budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001 and ending on June 30, 2002 is adopted as set forth herein:

SECTION TWO: This budget ordinance shall be administered by the executive authority as prescribed and set forth in the Kentucky Revised Statutes. Administration shall include, but not be limited to at least the following:

- an entity's revised statutes. Administration shall include, but not be limited to at least the following:
- Preparation and submission of financial statements which include budgetary comparisons on not less than a quarterly basis.
 - Provide for budget amendments if requested by the legislative body or if anticipated through administration and implementation.
 - Prepare any financial statements required for publication purposes, pursuant to KRS 424 and 91A.
 - Cause each fund of this budget to be audited as prescribed by law.

SECTION THREE: The detailed operating budget is adopted by reference for administration, accounting and reporting purposes.

SECTION FOUR: This ordinance shall be published in the newspaper by title and summary within thirty (30) days after adoption.

SECTION FIVE: This ordinance becomes effective immediately upon passage and publication as required by law.
