Rockcastle kicks off Rinse and Return Recycling Program

The Rockcastle County Conservation District recently announced the 2001 kick-for for the Rinse and Return Plastic Container Recycling Program. They encourage all farmers, farm supply dealers and other pesticide users to participate in this exciting recycling program.

The Conservation District has scheduled collection dates for Rockcastle will be Spenmer 6, 2001 Rockcastle will be simported, run through a chipping machine and the material will be shipped to a facility to be reused in the manufacture of new pesticide containers.

How to participate: (1) Triple rinse or pressure rinse all containers when emptied. Remember, it is best to rinse containers immediately after they are containers immediately after they are emptied. Some pesticide residues solidify quickly, and become difficult to remove from the container is left in the jug. (2) Dispose of the pesticide caps and remove sleeves and labels from containers. The pesticide caps are made of a different plastic material that cannot be currently recycled. 
