On October 25, 2001, the Secre-fary of Agriculture announced the intention to release burley lobacco farm designation information, including pounds designation to sell at a specific market location. Since the release of this information, farmers with an incorrect designation were faced with a lengthy delay in market-ing tobacco under regular redesignation policy.


