Gardening & Landscaping Tips

Plant These Trees Now for Springtime Blooming

Though springtime may seem far away when the land looks bare and bleak, now is the time to plant that specimen tree that will bloom in full glory next season. Now is the time to plant those Bradford Pears you so admire lining the driveway of a neighborhood home.

Now is the time. Beat the next year's price increases. Even find closeouts. The plant's roots will go ahead and be growing whenever soil temperatures are above freezing. Properly planted, results from fall planted stock will exceed in comparison.

For profuse white masses of color early, consider flowering pears such as Bradford or one of the improved cultivars. And crab apples from fall size down to a smaller spreading tree like Sargent variety. For a shrub size, a star magnolia blooms very early and profusely.

Other white bloomers include dogwood, service berries and white blooming redbuds.

Pink or red or purple bloomers are glorious trees following a brown, grey or white winter. A pink blooming Saucer magnolia or a purple blooming Jane magnolia that have many large petals opening gloriously before new leaves appear are a treat in very early spring. Flowering cherries, lots of crab apple varieties, redbuds and pink dogwoods all are on our list to create early blooms in your yards.

A couple of special and newer options for your home landscape are available. Thundercloud flowering plants retain a wonderful purple foliage all summer following the pink blooms of early spring. This is a wonderful low mess small tree that will grow most anywhere except in deep shade. Velvet Pillar flowering crab apple has an upright shape like an Aristocrat or Cleveland Select flowering pear, pink blooms and a velvet color all summer. Also has hardy fruit drops. A good street/sidewalk tree.
