Disaster Leasing of Burley Tobacco Producers wishing to lease to-sacco to their faim for the purpose of selling excess tobacco may do so, across county lines under the disas-ter leasting eligibility provisions. Larmis leasing in-pounds must have filed a FSA 378 (Crop Report), file a MQ 99 (Statement of Tobacco Pro-so-be-lightle for price-support MQ 99 (Statement of Toolacco Fro-duction), be eligible for price support and have an approved PSA 375, Lease and Transfer. This year the producer must also file an FSA 808, Designation of Burley Tobacco Sales and Request for Marketing Card.
