Mt. Vernon fire chief John C. Cox died in February. He was 81 and still serving as the department's chief, a position he had held for 36 years.

Also in February, tobacco farmers received a 34 percent hit quota.

Junior Kaleisa Robinson was named basketball's homecoming queen at RCHS and U.S. Senator Mitch McConnell received a warm welcome when he visited the county.

Representatives from the Kentucky State Department of Education conducted an audit at RCHS to determine if the school was complying with Title IX.

Title IX refers to the equality in high schools between boys and girls. The school passed the audit.

Rockcastle County civic leader and Kentucky Highlands Chairman Wayne Stewart was honored for his service to the county and the Rockcastle County Technology Center at the Rockcastle County Courthouse.

The state turned down a grant proposal for a new Animal Shelter

and residents got a look at a new route from Hwy. 150 to F-75 through Crab Orchard and the Mt. Vernon City Council voted for drug testing for employees.

The Lady Rockets and Rockets were both knocked out of the district tournament in the first round and the Rockcastle County Kiwanis Club raised over \$4,000 during their radiothon.

Former Rockcastle County magistrate Charles Holbrook was killed in an explosion and fire at Ottawa and

the Rockcastle County Board of Education approved a five percent pay increase.

Wayne Stewart died and Berea National announced they would open a branch bank in Rockcastle County. A Somerset man was apprehended a few minutes after he held up B&L Grocery at gunpoint.

Census figures showed that the county grew by 12 percent over the past ten years and Davy Stewart of Orlando, who was eventually found guilty in federal court and who is still under indictment for murder, was released on bond.

A life-size bronze statue of legendary Renfro Valley entertainer Old Joe Clark was dedicated in April and outgoing RCHS principal Ruth Allen received the Betty Lewis Service award for her dedication to children.

The school got \$208,000 from the state because of their good test scores and 387 cases of abuse and neglect were reported the previous year.

RCHS officials announced they would add volleyball to the list of girls sports to comply with Title IX. The RCHS basketball team made it the state again, losing to Hazard in the first round of the sectionals and the RCHS girls track team was ranked first in the state in class 2A.

Miss Kentucky Whitney Boyles visited the county and a 14-year-old beat his uncle to death.

Roundstone School received an award for being a Distinguished Title I School.

Parker Seal Plant in Berea closed and John Hale was chosen as principal at RCHS.

170 graduates received diplomas at RCHS and the RCHS girls track team finished second in the state in Class 2A.

Leon Davidson was chosen principal at Mt. Vernon and the Broadhead Senior Citizens Center closed.

The Mt. Vernon council approved a \$2.2 million dollar budget and the old Broadhead School building was torn down.

Anthony Coffey was named principal at the middle school and the county applied for another grant for an animal shelter.

An insecticide found at Mullins Station killed several animals and a Corbin robbery ended when the accused robber and a London police officer wrecked on I-75.

A Calloway man was charged with two counts of attempted murder after he shot at Mt. Vernon police

Chief Bill Mink and officer Barry Adams.

Woody Lamb later pled guilty. A Broadhead woman was killed when an RTCC van was involved in a wreck that was another motorist's fault and Rockcastle played host to the National Speological Society's National Convention.

Broadhead School was not completed by August 15th when school started, so students there did not go to school until August 27th.

Dr. Kevin Rowe began his medical practice and several Broadhead businesses were damaged by a very bad flash flood.

The Rockcastle Fiscal Court voted to offer health insurance to employees for the first time ever.

Kentucky Governor Paul Patton visited the county and I-75 Speedway at Cove Branch opened.

A three-year-old Broadhead youth died in a drowning accident. Stephen Russell Baldwin was with his parents visiting relatives when he got into a neighbor's pool.

Roundstone School had the highest CTBS test scores in the state and the fiscal court took over ownership of the former Livingston School property.

Angela Boring was crowned RCHS homecoming queen and the Rockets had a historical football season.

The Rockets won the district, region and finished runner-up in the state. They were 14-1 and had at least 5,500 fans attend their championship game in Louisville.

Two Mexican farm laborers were shot to death at Bee Lick and police arrested local residents time and time again for making and trafficking in Meth.

Solid Waste Coordinator Don Coyle was killed in an accident while riding his bike and well known resident Roy Brown died.

Ky. Farm Bureau agent William K. Bullen retired and Penny Poyner was named Renfro Valley Jamboree Bowl Queen at RCHS.

The Rockcastle Hospital bought Sowder Nursing in Broadhead and the Rockcastle School system got some good news from the state on their test scores.

The county's grant application for a new animal shelter was finally approved in the amount of \$62,000.

Juanita Medley was named Citizen of the Year at Livingston and a large crowd attended the Bittersweet Festival in Mt. Vernon.

A couple from India were de-

tained after a false alarm at the Mt. Vernon Water plant. They were released later that day.

School Psychologist Kenna Latham was beaten to death and her husband Phillip was charged with murder.

Davy Stewart was sentenced to 40 years in prison in federal court and Dell Pender received the Everett C. Brown Award for public service.

Frank Bond, 34, of Pine Hill was arrested after making threats against Circuit Judge Debra Lambert.

John Kenner, 20, died after a tractor rolled over on him and the county approved a permit for a new garbage hauler.

Renfro Valley Barn Dance founder John Lair was named one of the first twelve inaugural members of the Kentucky Country Music Hall of Fame.

Filings for the upcoming May Primary began and WRVW Radio Station was sold.

Howard Saylor announced he would seek the office of County-Judge Executive and all incumbent office holders have now filed, including current County-Judge Buzz Carlisle.

The Rockcastle Kiwanis Club held a very nice ceremony for veterans, firefighters and police officers, and Kentucky Chief Justice Joseph Lambert of Mt. Vernon filed for reelection to the state's highest court.

The RCHS JROTC Rifle Team won their third State Air Rifle Championship and Jackie Renner and Larry Boring were named for reelection to the state's highest court.

A former Rockcastle resident Larry Stidham and his son, James, of Broadhead were arrested in December and charged with the murder of a Clay County man.

Senior Adam Childress was named as an Honorable Mention defensive lineman. Childress played on both sides of the ball for the Rockets this year, and was named the Defensive MVP of the Renfro Valley Jamboree Bowl.

Two Rockets will already have an All-State honor under their belts as they enter their senior season. Junior quarterback Aaron Anderkin and junior running back Marty Reagan were also named Honorable Mention All-State at their respective positions.

Anderkin broke virtually every single-season passing record for the Rockets this season. He finished the year with just over 2,800 yards and 41 touchdowns. His 41 touchdowns passed the state of Kentucky.

Reagan's 1,000 yard rushing season complemented the Rockets passing attack, an attack Reagan was very much a part of, as he received for over 600 yards as well.

Rocket head coach Tom Larkey was named the Associated Press coach of the year for the second consecutive year. Boyle County head coach Chuck Smith was named the Coaches Poll coach of the year with Larkey getting third in that vote.

The Rockets ended with a 14-1 record and were state runners-up. This year's squad advanced further than any Rocket team before them.
