Education provides source of hope and purpose to female inmates

Among fhem, they are mothers, wives, homeinakers, students and for the coming months, they are also prisoners. Incarcerated for various felonies, the women are state immates and currently housed at a local county jail in the CAP service area, a facility that accommodates those convicted on state charges, in addition to individuals brought up on local offenses. Gince a week, Jamet Heinz, a CAP employee, who teaches adult education, passes through heavily secure, reinforced metal doors and proceeds to a small windowless; soon where she is equipped with a

They are pointe, soft spoken, kind to one another and their cacher. More definitive of the group is that they are easy going, somewhat shy, demure and delightful to speak with. Each one, cager to pursue their education and make it ount foward their future. As pirations of the class vary from mursing to architecture to eld-erly care. Their studies encompass reading, science, mathematics, lit-

Each will accurate at their own pace, some will finish white ideac cerated, while a few may complete their testing on the 'outside.' It's difficult to study as everyone to on a different schedule. Some of the women provide some functional duty, or rather, hold a job within the, jail, whether it is sworking in juni-torial maintenance or preparing the meals that will be consumed by the matter and staff. Some work well into the evening, while others keep more conventional evident to four.

time is very difficult. This impediment deep not deter the women from continuing to pursue their studies, as they come to class prepared and cager to learn.

"During a typical day we will review reading assignments, do some games, some individual study, some work on math, some are testing, if goes very fast," said Janet.
