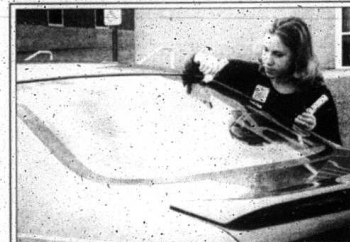

FCCLA meetings are always interesting. Pictured are Ben Graves, Tanner Abney and Adam Childress battling it out in a pie-eating contest.



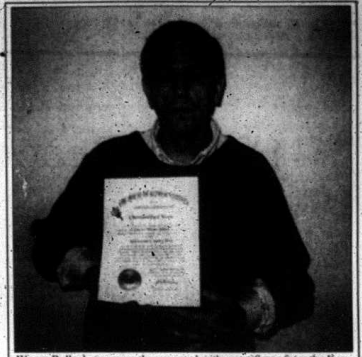
Bridgette Lear gives Rachelle Riddle a boost as the FCCLA paints the town in support of the football team.
