all eligible producers. The referen-dum period for dark air-cured (types. 35 and 36) and fir-cured (types. 23 will be March 18 through March 22, 2002.

Persons who were engaged in the production of tobacco in 2001 will be eligible to vote in the referendum for that kind.

If a majority of the producers vot-ing in a referendum for the ma-dacty grading of that kind of ty-bacco, USDA will ensure that kind of tobacco is graded at the time of sale for the 2002 and subsequent marketing years. The USDA is also directed to establish user fees for any such inspections. These fees would be established in the same manner and be comparable to user fees for the grading of tobacco sold at auc-

FSA Reminds Foreigners of
AFIDA Requirement

Foreigners with have bought or
sold agricultural land in Rickcastle
County are reminded to report the
transaction to the local Farm Service
Agency office. Warden Alexander

(formerly ASCS) said.

Agricultural Foreign Investment Dis-closure Act, (AFIDA) which is still in effect," Alexander said. Foreign investors are required to file a report

For reporting purposes, agricu-tural land is any tract of more than 10 acres in the aggregate now farming, ranching, forestry or timb production. Land used for forest production is land exceeding 10 acr production. Land used for forestry production is land exceeding 10 acres in which 10 percent is stocked by trees of any size, including land that formerly had such tree cover and will be naturally or artificially regener-ated. "This includes land in agricul-
