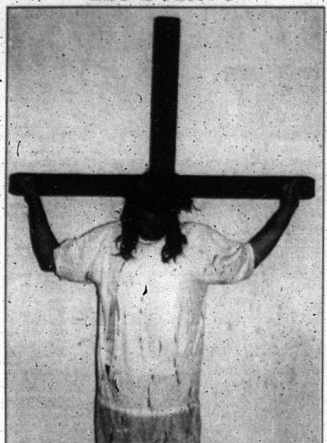
Easter Cantata
