Mattingly's science class are cur-rently participating in two initiatives sponsored by NASA. The first in-volves students in ongoing climate research. Students work with NASA to study how clouds affect the Earls energy balance. Part of a long-term stellite experiment, the NASA's Su-dents' Cloud. Observations On-Line (SCOOL) activity consists of over 1000 schools worldwide gathering data about clouds. Sixth-grade students were trained in August on how to collect the cloud data. Since that time students have provided NASA with over 100 valuable data points. In fast, Mr.

Mattingly's classes made the 100 10 observers list for August.

The second initiative involves preparing satellite mirrors to be launched into earth orbit. As participants in project Starshine, Mr. Mattingly's students received three mirrors that they needed to poists. They began by using aluminum oxide to grind the mirrors flat. Then they used two different sizes of diamond polishing paste to create a mirrored aufface. These mirrors are sent back to Starshine headquaters, where they are placed on the surface of a satellite.

The satellite is scheduled for launch in January 2003. After launch, observers all over the world will be able to track the satellite based on the reflection of sunlight off its mirrors. This reflection will enable discription to determine the height of
