

Health occupation student excels at state competition

Health occupation students from across Kentucky won awards at the 2002 Kentucky Health Occupations Students of America (HOSA) Leadership Conference competition held March 14-16 in Louisville. State winners are eligible to attend the national conference in California this summer.

Brittney Thomas of Rockcastle County ATC placed second in the Medical Spelling competition.

The winning theme for this year's competition came from the Madison County Area Technology Center. It was "HOSA... Changing the Future of Health Care, One Member at a Time."

The various competitions, sponsored by HOSA and the Kentucky Department for Technical Education, an agency of the Cabinet for Workforce Development, included performance skills in areas such as CPR, nursing assisting, veterinary assisting and written tests in areas such as medical terminology and medical math.

HOSA is a student organization that promotes leadership, skills ap-

plication and critical thinking among students in health fields.

Students benefit from state financial aid

Rockcastle County students received \$827,734 in need-based state grants, merit-based Kentucky Educational Excellence scholarships (KEES), and low-interest student loans to help pay for college or technical training during the 2000-01 school year.

Of that amount, Rockcastle County students received 141 College Access Program (CAP) Grants totaling \$133,105; 63 Kentucky Tuition Grants (KTG) totaling \$87,572; 105 KEES awards totaling \$76,787; and 127 Federal Stafford Loans totaling \$528,270.

In addition to KEES, CAP, KTG and Federal Stafford Loans, the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA) administers the Teacher Scholarship, Osteopathic Medicine Scholarship, KHEAA Work-Study, Kentucky Education Savings Plan Trust, Federal PLUS Loan for parents, and Federal Consolidation Loan programs.

KHEAA also provides free planning materials to students and families. KHEAA's Getting It Right contains facts on admissions, costs, academic majors and major financial aid programs for Kentucky postsecondary schools. Three brochures that are particularly helpful are *Student Fi-*

nancial Aid Programs, which briefly describes KHEAA's aid programs; *Top 10 Student Financial Aid Tips*, which can help students learn how to find and apply for financial aid; and *Surf the Net*, which lists the Web addresses for Kentucky colleges and universities and other sites that provide free higher education and student financial aid information.

KHEAA's website www.kheaa.com also contains a wealth of information, including links to free scholarship searches, college aid and loan repayment calculators; and *Adults Returning to School*, KHEAA's online higher education guide for nontraditional students.

Affordable, Higher Education, a financial aid reference book with over 2,700 sources of aid specifically for Kentucky students, can also be found on KHEAA's website, in public and school libraries, and at high school guidance offices.

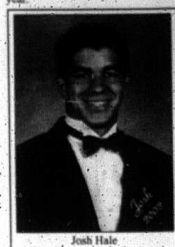
Josh Hale is recipient of Georgetown Scholarship

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"What Saith the Scriptures"
