SBDM Parent Membership Guidelines

Parent members must be the parent, stepparent or foster parent of a child, who will be enrolled at Broadhead Elementary during the 2002-03 school year. Legal guardians are also considered parents if the child lives with them.

Parent members may not have a conflict of interest as defined by KRS Chapter 45A, which deals with doing business with the district.

Parent members must not be BES or Central Office employees, relatives of a BES or Central Office employee, members of the district school board or spouse of district school board members. Persons employed at other schools in our district and their relatives may be parent members of our council.

The PTA will be Supervising the SBDM Election. According to Carolyn Hunt, PTA President, SBDM nominations will be accepted beginning May 1 and ending May 10 @ 3:30. You may

send nominations to school in an envelope. These envelopes will be placed at the PTA mailbox or you may drop them at the front desk and the receptionist will place them in the box.
