School-based decision making was created in 1990 to involve teachers, parents, and principals in the process of helping all students reach higher standards of achievement. School councils have legal authority to make important decisions about teaching and learning in their own schools.

This opportunity for parents to be key decision-makers in schools is unique in the nation. No other state requires virtually all schools to have councils with parents as full members and with legal decision-making authority.

Parents should:

VOTE - in school council elections.

RUN - for school council positions as candidates

PARTICIPATE - in the school council committee structure by volunteering to serve on a committee or attending

committee and council meetings. You can serve if you have a child who will be enrolled in the middle school for the 2002-2003 school year and do not have a
