It's best to buy pre-packaged foods such as canned goods, juices, and no-freeze dinners in vacuum-packed containers. Canned foods don't require cooking, water, or

It might be more practical to serve more generous portions of fewer types of foods if water or power are limited. Store canned and dry foods in a cool area away from heat and light.
