

CAP celebrates elderly services

Dogwoods bursting in bloom on the banks of the lake at Camp Andrew Jackson provided a picturesque backdrop to a gathering of close to fifty senior adults in a day of fun, food, fellowship and free prizes supplied by the Christian Appalachian Project's Elderly Program. The coun-

ties of Jackson, Clay, Rockcastle, McCreary and Owsley were represented at the gathering.

The day was designed to promote community, socialization and comradery. While allowing an opportunity to celebrate springtime, elderly individuals came together at Old Hickory, an activity building on the premises of CAP's summer camp in Jackson County.

CAP's chaplain, Richard Ginn addressed the crowd with a comical, yet sensitive look at approaching the increasing years of age and how spiritual allowance comes into play.

The crowd was entertained with a musical number on harmonica by Cliffie B. Strong, an elderly participant and local artisan, who is not only a musical virtuoso, but a talented wood carver. An array of wooden pieces, hand crafted by Cliffie, the Owsley county native, were admired by everyone. On display were carved

chairs with woven seats, handmade beds, farm tools, links of chain, finely sanded with precision and a skill honed after years of practice and patience. Cliffie and others like her shared stories, photos and an afternoon of treasured memories.

In a traditional cake walk, California volunteer Janet Fielder, furnished the gathering with nearly thirty baked pies, cookies and cakes, as each senior parade around the room for chances at winning a tasty treat. Everyone walked home a winner, with door prizes awarded for bingo as well, provided by CAP's Operation Sharing with merchandise from Bed, Bath and Beyond, Sears, Hallmark and Avon.

The purpose of CAP's Elderly Services are to provide the Elderly with companionship. Their focus is to decrease isolation and increase socialization. By providing extra support in the home for the families and the agencies working with the elderly, it allows individuals to remain in their home as long as possible

without extended care or facility living.

The Christian Appalachian Project is an interdenominational, nonprofit Christian service organization, committed to serving people in need in Appalachia by providing physical, spiritual and emotional support through education, crisis intervention and community development. With more than seventy programs and services, CAP's efforts reach people through the thirteen Appalachian states.
