Court rules for county on Oscar Isaac roadway

The Rockcastle Circuit Court has issued a Judgement in the Oscar Isaac Road case, where the county had been seeking to obtain the legally required 30 feet right-of-way in order to construct and maintain the

The suit, brought in August, 2000, was an effort by the Fiscal Court to maintain a controversial roadway, after some residents brought their concerns to the Rockcastle Fiscal

In the 1970's the court had received by deed less than the amount of the roadway required by law, and was prohibited, we required by law, and was prohibited when the roadway to the road were in dispute as to ownership by adjacent landowners.

As a result, the Fiscal Court brought suit to condemn necessary portions of the roadway to bring it in

portions of the roadway to bring it in compliance with statutes requiring a 30 foot right-of-way for county main-
