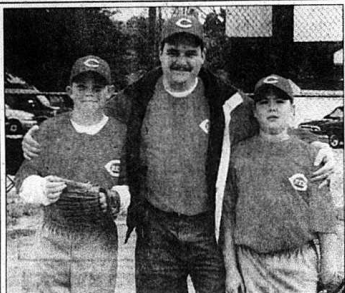

Road projects announced

The Rockcastle Fiscal Court has announced several road projects, which will begin soon.

Sweetwater-Conway Road will be resurfaced its entire 4.38 miles from Copper Creek intersection to intersection with 1505. The state has granted the contract.

The county also learned this week that it can now proceed with construction of the Newborn Cemetery Road Bridge over Roundstone Creek. The project had been held up by the state's environmental office.

The contract for the Mullins Station Road Bridge has been awarded to N&N Construction of Mt. Vernon.

The county will demolish the old structure to make way for the bridge.

County Judge Buzz Carlotti said that the county has already spent \$85,000 for repairs made to county roads, bridges, tiles and water lines because of damage from recent heavy storms.

Holbrook and Leece are the only two Democrats on the local ballot.

Incumbent second district magistrate Jack Bradley faces his cousin William Denny.

In the fourth district, incumbent Fred Mullins, Jr., faces five challengers, Roger Rucker, Gary Burdette, Ronnie Lamb, Leonard Miller and Wayne D. Harding.

In the fifth district, longtime incumbent Don Bullock has seven opponents.

They are: Mark G. Poynter, Merrill Keith Brown, George Renner, Randy Stewart, William Mullins, Homer Copie and Ralph E. Allen.

First district constable Randall Stevens faces Roger Alcorn and Frankie D. Woodall.

Second district constable Delmo McClure faces Shannon York, Charlie Newcomb and Steve Griffin.

In the third district, Stanley R. Payne and Ronald Dale Simpson are seeking to replace Roy Perriman, who did not run.

Incumbent Leonard Dale Miller faces Donnie Copie, Roger G. Pigg, Richard Dean and Craig Clark in the fourth district constable's race.

In district five Albert Wayne Carpenter, David Mason and Ryan S. Messinger are seeking the seat now held by Tommy Bullen, who did not run.

Bullen has current pending criminal charges.

U.S. Congressman Harold Rogers of Somerset is being challenged by little known Billy Ray Wilson of London.

Former Congressman Tom Barlow faces Lois Combs Weinberg, a daughter of former Governor Bert T. Combs in the Democrat Primary for U.S. Senate. The winner will face Republican Mitch McConnell.

There are 11,340 local residents currently registered to vote in the May Primary.

Polls will open at 6 a.m. and close at 6 p.m. County Clerk Norma Houk said this week that anyone needing to know where to vote should call or stop by her office on the second floor of the courthouse.

After the Primary, registration books will re-open and residents can register or switch parties.

The Rockcastle County Board of Election Commissioners remind everyone of the following election information, concerning next Tuesday's election.

The location of the Brown Voting Precinct has been changed beginning with the May 28th primary election. The Brown precinct has been moved to the lot beside Willalla Grocery off Highway 70.

Electioneering is prohibited at the polling place and within 500 feet of the polling place.

To comply with the electioneering law, all signs, posters or advertisements must be removed within 500 feet of the polling place. This must be done by 6:00 a.m. on election day.
