Loan Deficiency Payment (LDP)

(LDP)
Producers who retain beneficial

interest in a commodity eligible for a loan or a loan of deficiency payment are eligible for payment if all of the following remain with the producer; control of the commodity, responsible for loss, title of the commodity, crops must have been produced on contract acreage (AMTA).

ESA realizes that many farmers may begin feeding, thus; the loss of beneficial interest occurs. Anyone who has lost title, risk and control of the crop, is NOT eligible for benefits. Final loan and LDP availability dates for the 2001 crop are: Corn, crimin, Sorphum and Soybeanss—May 31, 2002.


