Critter's Inrive in Homemade Ecosystems
Songbirds have always been welcome in yards and gardens. People
put out houses with hopes of getting
some feathered tenants to move in.
Now retailers carry more kinds of
bird feed than dog feed it seems.
Some garden centers are stocking bee
boxes, butterfly houses and even bat
houses.

And why wouldn't we attract but-terflies, bees, spiders, ladybugs and so many more creatures? After all, as we eliminate grass and go for a more natural look, these little critters will

natural look, these little critters will like our yards as super places to call home and raise their families. You don't need to necessarily put out brithouses or load abodes, but as you grow a more divergent number of plants and shrubs, all sorts of wild-life will be attracted to your place. We may like brids, toads, squir-rels and chipmunks. (The couple who had a chipmunk art through the pond liner recently may not be too eager to see another chippounk.) We may think we dislike spiddes, snakes, mice and bats. But do you have any idea how many mice a snake cast? Or how many insects a frog or a spikder and bats. But do you have any boo-how many mice a snake eats? Or how many insects a frog or a spixder catches? And bats have been known to eat 1,000 mosquitoes per hour while flittering around in the

while flittering around in the evening!

So if you like some birds or other good" creatures in your yard, please realize they may need other critters to prey on in order to obtain a bal-anced diet. So be willing to accept a few "bad" critters if you want to at-tract birds and other wildlife to your yard.

And it is reassuring to know most all wild critters are "wild" and are not aggressive, but indeed are afraid of the giant people who live in the big house in their yard.
