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Biffle gets second win at Milwaukee

WEST ALLIS, Wis.—Greg Biffle won Sunday's NASCAR Busch Series GNC Live Well 250 from the pole at The Milwaukee Mile, as he held off Jason Keller for his second win of the year and fifth straight top-five finish. Biffle also won the same race last year.

With the points leader Jack Sprague having a rough day and finishing 14th, it allowed Biffle to move into the second spot in the standings, just 46 points behind Sprague.

P. B. Thomson, Georgia: Would you explain what a provisional means.

NASCAR established provisionals to insure that big name drivers always made the starting field.

There are 43 drivers that start the Busch and Winston Cup races. The top-36 starting spots are determined by qualifying time. Provisional starting positions determine positions 37 through 43.

Through the first four races of the season, positions 37 through 42 are assigned based on the previous year's final Winston Cup car owner points.

After the four races into the season, these six positions (37-42) will be based on the current car owner

standings.

Each car owner is allotted four provisional starting positions at the start of the season. In addition, car owners will be given one provisional after his/her driver has attempted to qualify for eight events for a maximum season allotment of eight starting positions for the entire season.

The 43rd and final provisional is a championship provisional. A former Winston Cup champion may use up to eight championship provisionals during the season.
