Eligible acreage devoted to certain special conservation practices such as ripartina buffers, filter strips, grassed waterways, shelter belts, living smow fences, contour grass strips, salt tol-reation vegetation and shallow water areas for wildlife may be enrolled at any time under CCC's continuous CRP sign-up. 
