

## Two RCHS students attend conference

Travis Burton and Jamie Omella, recently represented Rockcastle County at the Youth Conference on National Affairs (CONA). The conference was held in the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina and sponsored by the national YMCA.

National Affairs was created in 1968 as a way to bring together teens from America's Youth in Government and Model UN programs. State Officers, outstanding speakers and exceptional proposal presenters from 35 states assemble to present and debate current issues in this unique environment. Each of the nearly 500 delegates must submit a proposal on a matter of national or international concern. Burton and Omella both did an excellent job preparing and presenting their proposals.

Burton was invited to be a part of the Kentucky delegation after receiving an Outstanding Speaker Award at the Kentucky Youth Assembly as well as being elected President of the Security Council at the Kentucky United Nations Assembly. This is one of two major offices at the Kentucky mock United Nations. He will be pre-

side over the Security Council at KUNA 2003.

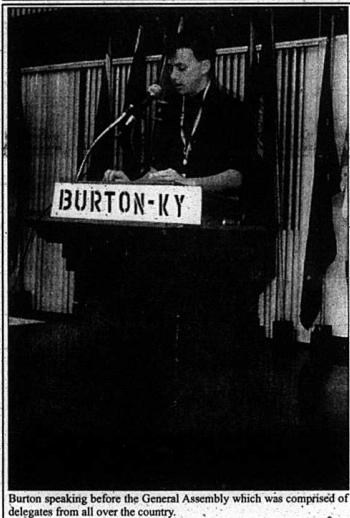

Burton was chosen to be an intense speaker against the removal of military tribunals, which granted him extra speaking time on that subject. He also was able to give a short speech to the assembly on the importance of improving education. Omella was recognized to speak in favor of placing a morning prayer in the school day nation wide. She gave a very passionate speech which helped the proposal pass. Both delegates also spoke many times in committees.

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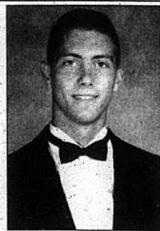
