Pursuant to a default judgment and order of sale entered in this case on June 24, 2002, I will offer at public auction the hereinafter described real property and personal property located in Rockcastle County, Kentucky:

AT THE COURTHOUSE IN THE CITY OF MT. VERNON, ROCKCASTLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, ON EAST MAIN STREET ON THURSDAY, AUGUST 8, 2002, BEGINNING AT THE HOUR OF 10:00 A.M., OR THEREABOUTS, THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED REAL PROPERTY, TO WIT:

BEGINNING at a chestnut and dogwood in line of Jack Scott, about 100 yards southeast of said Scott's house on the point of ridge; there is a straight line southeast to a dogwood near the top of the ridge; thence northeast to a black walnut on the top of the ridge; with the cliff and field to the southeast corner of Russell Howard's field at the top of the ridge; thence in a straight line to the west side of the State Road; thence northerly with the west side of the State Road to two large white oaks on the west side of the State Road; thence with the same and down the creek to Jack Scott's line; thence with the same to the place of beginning and containing (30) acres, more or less.
