The Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 provides for
GRAZE-OUT payments instead of

eligible producers who:

- Elect to use acreage planted to

- Begins on the first day of me-

The application period for Graze-Out:

\* Begins on the first day of me-chanical harvest as determined by the local FSA County Committee.

\* Ends on March 31 of the calendar year following the year the crop is normal harvested.

Producers may file an application for GRAZE-OUT anytime during this application period. Producers may not cancel or withdraw an ap-

may not cancel or withdraw an ap-plication once requested. Loan Deficiency Payment (LDP) Eighbilty In accordance with the provisions of the new farm bill, FSA has recently issued LDP provisions to extend el-gibility to commodities grown in 2001 on non-Production Flexibility. Contract (PFC) farms. In addition a special beneficial interest waiver will be available to producers who mat-keted 2001 crop year eligibility com-modities before applying for their LDP payment.

modities before applying to LDP payment.
Because the Act provided authority to accept LDP requests on commodities produced on non-PFC farms beyond the final loan availability date, the provision was extended to

beyond the final loan availability date, the provision was extended to include PFC farms to ensure program equity among all producers of eligible contract commodities.

The ending date for application will be announced by FSA as soon as regulations are published: Producers who previously requested LDPs, but were disapproved based not beneficial interest, will be able to apply for their LDP on that 2001 production.

Remember: If you are a farmer whose tobacco is suffering from poor weather conditions, black shank, blue mold, root disease, etc., please come to the FSA office and file under the disaster provisions PRIOR TO HAR-

beginning with the 2001 crop year for tobacco, producers were required to inform FSA of the warehouse where they would market tobacco. This is acquired by completing the form FSA 808, Warehouse Designation, to in-dicate where the tobacco will be sold. Initial designation will end August 1, 2003. Producers are encouraged to complete this form after all lease and transfers have been updated. After the initial designation period ends pro-ducers will be limited to designate for the farm to any one day during the the farm to any one day during the following regular redesignation pe-

riods:

- September 30-October 4, 2002, with card effective October 14, 2002.

- October 28-November 1, 2002, with card effective November 11, 2002.

- December 02-December 06, 2002, with card effective November 16, 2002.

December 2002, with eard effective Local 16, 2002.
December 27-January 3, 2003, with eard effective January 13, 2003. The warehouse will be indicated with a number on the market eard. FSA has a listing for public notice of warehouses, receiving stations and dealers posted on the bulletin board in the gounty office available through Marcif 31, 2003.
