## Something To Think About

SHOULD CHILDREN ATTEND THE FUNERAL?

The funeral is a sad, but impor-tant event in the life of a family. Gen-erally speaking, there is little justifi-cation for not permitting a child to phriticipate. It allows them to express their own love and devotion. Keep-ing them away, may damage their sense of belonging and deprive them of the opportunity to share their emo-tions. thinks it might be. At the same time, try not to make them feel any shame or guilt for wanting to stay home.
