#### **Action Research Project** improves classroom instruction

Rockcastle County Middle School mathematics teachers are in their second year of participation in an Action Research Project sponsored by the Eisenhower Regional Consortium for Mathematics and Science at AEL. The project focuses on using assessment data to improve classroom instruction and student learning. The teachers began the project in the fall of 2000 by analyzing data from the Kentucky Core Content Test and the CTBS in order to choose a

and the CTBS in order to choose a target content rest and the CTBS in order to choose a target content strand to improve strand of algoret. The 7th and 8th grade teachers choise the core content strand of algoret and the 6th grade teachers choise the core content strand of algoret and the 6th grade teachers chose division. A "research partner" provided by AEL convened the action research group monthly after school to plan how to incorporate research-based strategies, into instructional units, shares tudent work and address ways to bridge gaps in student learning. In addition to the monthly meetings, the teachers did individual research for instructional strategies and shared their research with the rest of the team.

"The Action Research has helped me with additional support and resources. It has also allowed the math department at the middle school to bend and share similar concerns as well as ideas on improving instruction," states Robbie Phillips.

Theresa Davis adds, "The AEL venture has been a wonderful project.

neresa Lavis adds, "The AEL venture has been a wonderful project that has provided the time and materials needed to improve our teaching of mathematics at RCMS."

The teachers began the 2001-02 school year by analyzing data from the Kentucky Core Content Test and the CTBS and again chose Algebra and division for improvement. The teachers and research partner continue to examine mathematics edu-cation research and best practices that the teachers can incorporate into

cation research and Dest practices used to teachers can incorporate into classroom instruction.

Sixth grade teacher, Brenda Ballinger, explains, "being a part of the Action Research Team has been beneficial because it has allowed much needed time for all the math-teachers in the school to plan together and discuss different strategies, More importantly we have been able to study our math scores and determine areas of need and develop a plan together to improve those needs."

This year the teachers will also participate in professional development activities plated to the chosen content stranks Gina Nicely relates. "I am pleased with the variety of strategies using manipulatives' I learned that are beneficial on yet units."

The teachers are paid an hourly stipend through the Kentucky Teach-ers Professional Growth Fund for participating in the project. Sheila Johnson adds, "AEL pro-

vides the support and practice in techordes the support and practice in techniques to improve student learning as well as the time to collaborate and discuss these techniques."

The math teachers have also developed an observation instrument to be used in their classrooms for ob-

servation and analysis of instruction.
