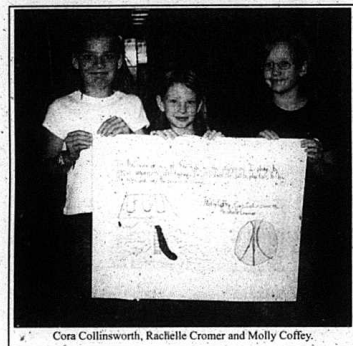
ment. Roundstone students celebrated Grandparents' Day on Friday, September 6th. The day was a huge success with over 200 grandparents visiting for lunch.

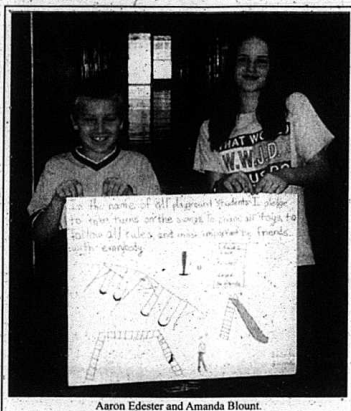

ploma) program. The new program is GED Connection and is designed to help any adult who wishes to prepare for the GED examination. The support program from KET offers workbooks, tutoring by phone, study tips, newsletters, test information, pre and post testing, and counseling, as well as encouragement. Department of Labor statistics show that GED graduates earn an average annual increase in income of \$6,000 more than high school dropouts.
