possession of the third quarter, giving Rockcastle possession at its own 48. Just as in the first quarter the Rockets hit paydirt with 10:06 on the clock with Anderton capping off a four play drive with a six-yard scoring pass to Stephen Boring. Taylor, added the PAT.

Taylor would boot through another extra point attempt in the third quarter following up a nine-yard touchdown run by Taylor. With the kick, the score was 36-0.

A Caleb Blair interception set Rockcastle up for its final score. Blair snagged the interception, one of four for the Rockets in game, around the Pat 45 and returned it 22 yards to the Lincoln 23.

Backup Quarterback Matthew Burkhardt scored the final touchdown going in from the four yard line with 1:42 left in the game.

Besides Reagan's and Anderton's stats offensively, Taylor had 55 yards on six carries, senior Ciel Swinney had 58 yards on seven carries, Blair had 16 yards on three carries, Brandon Campbell had 13 yards on two carries, Shay Mullins had six yards on two carries and Jamison Cable and Brandon Reams also carried the ball.

Taylor caught two passes for 31 yards, Hayes caught two for 44, Boring one for six, senior J.T. Lovell caught one for 12 yards, Josh Hayes caught one for nine yards and Ricky Sandusky caught two passes for six yards.

Defensively the Rockets were led by Boring, who had eight tackles and assists and intercepted one of four balls picked by the Rockets. Junior Devon Bussell, Reagan and Blair all had interceptions as well.

"The grand jury will consider all the evidence, including these potential felony charges," Reynolds said.

Officer Steve Isaacs who resides in Mt. Vernon and was assigned to Rockcastle in January of this year, said that the investigation is continuing in the case, and other charges and arrests are expected.
