Power of Attorney Forms

If you currently have a Power of Attorney on file with FSA, it is not valid for the new programs or trian-actions authorized by the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 (Farm Bill). If you wish to retain an agent to act on your behalf for the new Direct and Counter-Cyclical programs, a new Power of Attorney form is required.

The FSA Power of Attorney, form FSA-211, has been revised to cover rograms in the Act (referred to as the Farm Bill). Non-FSA power of attorney forms currently on file are not valid for any new programs are cautioned that the authorized by the Act. Warehouse Designation
Producers that did not designate their burley tobacco quota to a buy-ing point during the initial designa-tion period, which ended on August 1st, must wait until the first regular redesignation period. This program, authorized by the 2002 Farm Bill, financially compensates dairy producers when often the producers when the produced milk in any state and marketed the milk commercially be-ginning December 2001. To be approved for the program, producers must be in compliance with highly and wetland conservation provisions and must enter into a contract with USDA's Commodity Credit Corpo-ration to provide monthly marketing data.


