The work group stayed at the camp for the blind and physically handicapped from August 4th through the 10th. It consisted of sixteen people ranging in age from adolescence to adult. For this particular group, this mission trip was the first. Ashley Hauch was quoted as saying, "This is my first mission trip, and hopefully the first of many! I'm having the most awesome time here." 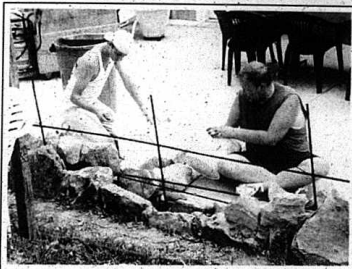
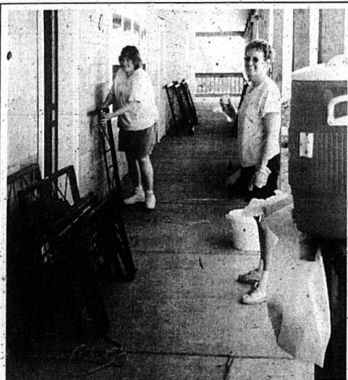
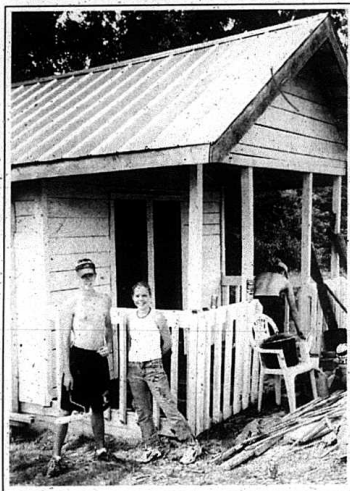
expect that this had been a work camp! Each participant rose early each morning to eat and get ready by eight a.m.

With Christ's Outreach for the Blind being under construction, there are many jobs to be done. Some of the tasks that the Racine, Wisconsin group contributed to were as follows: helping to construct a rock wall, staining the garden house, sanding and painting metal beds and cleaning trails.

Christ's Outreach for the Blind has enjoyed all of the groups that it has had this summer. Each group has added an extra special touch in the effort to near the end of construction so that the blind and physically handicapped can come.

With summer over, the camp continues its building phase and still is anticipating more mission work groups this fall. When the construction is completed, Christ's Outreach for the Blind will be a camp for the blind and physically handicapped. Some

During the 2002 session, he supported:

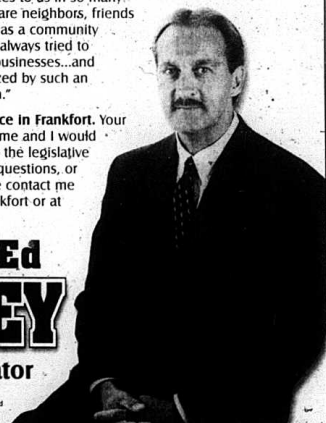
- Redevelopment of former industrial sites to promote new economic growth
