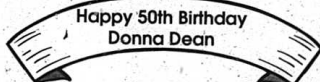
Local firefighters attend training

Thompson's brother, Nicky, 34, was also arrested the night of the raid, but on state charges.

According to authorities Nicky Thompson was charged with receiving stolen property, possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Police say they found two bags of marijuana, scales and a stolen ATV in a building that Thompson had the keys to in his pocket.

According to the citation Nicky Thompson told police that the ATV was his brother's and that the marijuana and scales were also his.

Nicky Thompson was lodged in the Rockcastle Detention Center and later released on a \$500 cash bond.
