#### Varsity places 6th Cross-Country girls finish state runners-up

The Rockcastle County Cross-Country teams competed in the animal KTCCCA Meet of Champions at Cave Lake Park in Wayne County this past Saturday. The meet was host to nearly two thousand competitors, including most of the best teams and runners in the state and featured the elementary and middle school state championships.

Rockcastle's elementary girls' team finished as state numera-up with with the state and featured the championships. Laura Dollins, the top-naked 5th grade cross-country runner in the state, narrowly missed her first state-championship with a record-setting performance. She shattered her own course record for a 5th grader and improved upon her own state best effort for 3,000-meters with an awe-some time of 12-42-52. Laura finished as state runner-up in a tightly contested race that saw only one other 5th grader make the top ten. She was defeated only by a sixth grade competitor.
