all in a personal best 15:21.4. 5th grader Kristen Roberts, who had practiced with the team for only a couple of weeks, ran very well and finished 109th with a time of 16:24.86. Since Rockcastle does not lose any competitors due to age, they will undoubtedly be the favorites for next year's team state title.

The boys' elementary team also had a great meet and finished 15th overall with several outstanding individual performances. Nearly 50 teams and 182 competitors were present. 5th grader Blake Parsons continued his racing brilliance with an exceptional race. Blake covered the 1.8-mile course in an amazing 11:58.87. He finished as state runner-up in a very close race and was defeated only by a sixth grade competitor. He finished the season as the top-ranked 5th grade boy in the state and will be the favorite for the state title next season. 5th grade teammate Andrew Pensol also had an exceptional race. Andrew finished 40th overall with an awesome personal best effort of 13:16.67. Both Andrew and Blake have participated in several varsity races this season and will play an integral part in the varsity boys' bid for a state championship berth. 3rd grade newcomer, Eric Roberts, after only a couple of weeks

with the team, ran an exceptional race, Eric finished 110th overall with a time of 14:51.44. 4th grader Elliot Jackson had an awesome race and placed 130th in 15:32.05. 5th grader teammate Devin Davidson completed the scoring for Rockcastle with an exceptional effort of his own. Devin finished the race with an excellent time of 17:28.76.

The RCHS varsity girls had a sensational meet. The formidable freshman duo of Kayla Hayes and Jessi Asher had tremendous efforts. Kayla placed 5th overall with an awesome performance. She covered the 3.1-mile course in an amazing 20:25.55. Jessi had her best race ever and finished in 6th place just behind Kayla. Jessi's time of 20:27.41 was a personal best. Both girls defeated three of the top ten runners in the state including the third and fourth ranked girls, as well as all competitors from their region. Sophomore Heather Hammond had a great race and finished 39th overall with an exceptional time of 22:49.6. Freshman Elizabeth Russell had a season's best effort. She finished 57th overall with an excellent time of 23:53.34. Freshman Ashley Bullock completed the scoring for RCHS with a 98th place finish in 31:17.49.

The RCHS boys also had a great

meet, although they lacked one more team member for a team score. Junior Andrew Nelson continued to run well at Cave Lake Park. Andrew placed 13th overall out of a field of 170 of the state's best boys. He covered the 3.1-mile course with an amazing new RCHS record time of 17:20.41, barely eclipsing Brandon Cole's old mark of 17:21. Sophomore Brandon Cole ran extremely well and finished 16th overall with a season's best effort of 17:30.08. Both Brandon and Andrew defeated several of the top twenty runners in the state. Sophomore Bill Burdett had an awesome race and placed 42nd overall with a new personal best time of 18:32.37. Junior Florian Trummer also ran well and finished 110th overall with a time of 20:46.38.

The teams will next compete this Saturday in the regional championships hosted by Lexington Catholic at the Kentucky Horse Park. Both boys' and girls' teams from RCHS have excellent chances to make the state championships.

The RCHS girls compete at 2:00 and the boys at 2:45.

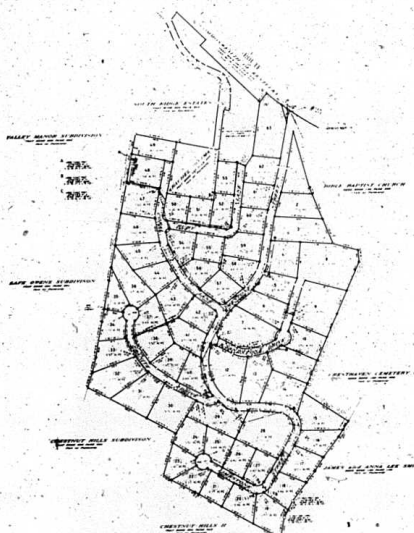
