the entire state of Kentucky for USDA emergency assistance due to USDA emergency assistance due to the drought this summer. This desig-nation qualifies livestock operation in Kentucky for a direct cash pay-ment under the Livestock Compen-

ment under the Livestock Compen-sation Program.

"We anticipate Kentucky farmer will receive in excess of \$20 millior under the Livestock Compensation Program," Hall said. "Farmers that owned eligible livestock as of June 1, 2002 for a period of 90 days on more before and/or after June 1 will be eligible to apply for a direct pay-ment."

The payment rate under the Live-ock Compensation Program is \$18 stock C per animal consuming unit, which is indexed against beef cattle. The pay-
