Larry McReynolds has served as
crew chief for NASCAR's best, in-Larry McReynolds has served as crew chief for NASCAR's best, in-cluding Davey Allison and Ernic Irvan, but his best memories center around his one and one-half seasons with Dale Earnhandt. Two years ago, McReynolds left his job with Richard Childress Rac-ing for a job with Fox Sperts as a tels-vision analyst and broadcaster, a job that he says is demanding, but very rewarding.

much into racing when I was growing up," he said. "I did have an uncle
that raced, but it wasn't until an aunt
