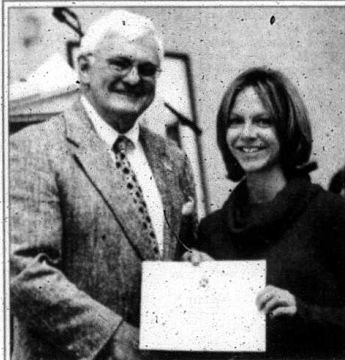

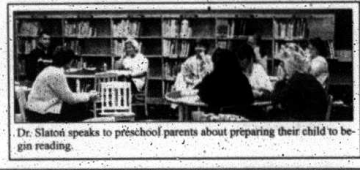
## Tiger Pause
