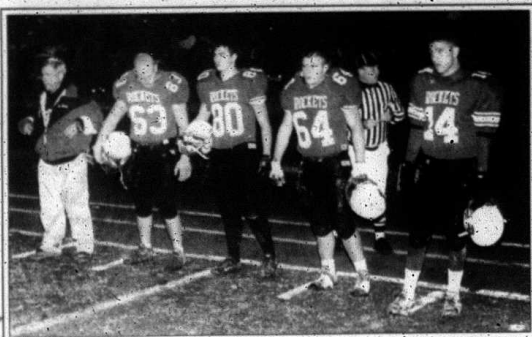
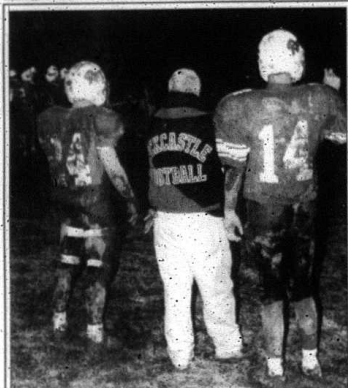

by Judge Danny Reeves in London.

Bullen entered a guilty plea on July 26, 2002, conspiring to possess with the intent to distribute over 500 grams of a mixture or substance containing cocaine, a Schedule II controlled substance, forfeiture of assets, and possessing firearms in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime.

Bullen was sentenced to 120 months in prison to be followed by four years supervised release and a \$200 special assessment.

The case was investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and Mt. Vernon Police Department. The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney, Stephen C. Smith.



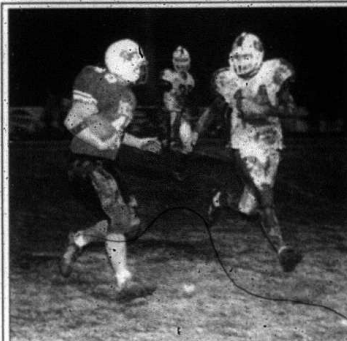
The Rockcastle County defense held Bell County scoreless in the second half Friday night. Above defensive coordinator Tony Saylor talks to his squad.
