Berry decorations could come from hollies and winterberries (leaf-less hollies), beautyberries, nandma domentica, pyracantha, bayberry, wax myrtle, sea bucktborn (eaberries), sumac, Indian hawthorns or bitnessweet.

Cones and seedleads could come from pines and Deodar cedars, magnolias, lonus flowers, perhaps wildflowers.
