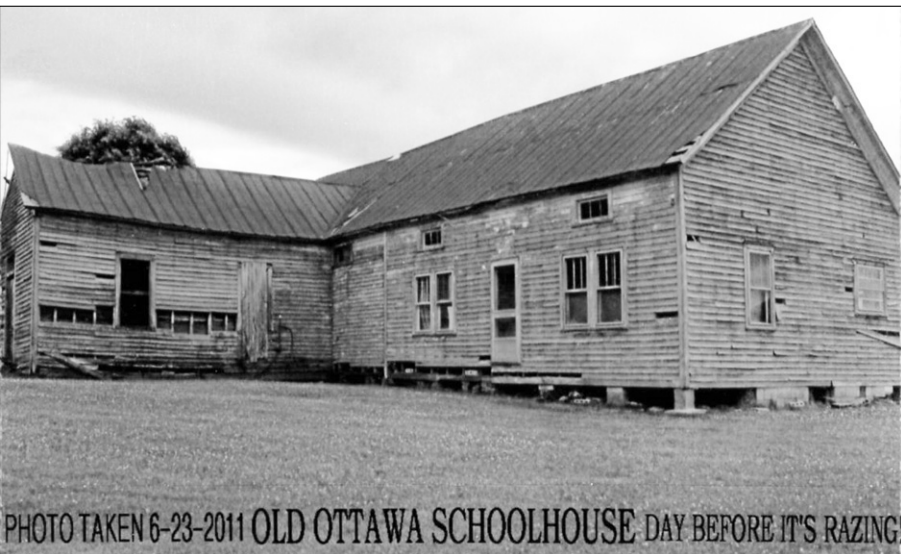


PHOTO TAKEN 6-23-2011 OLD OTTAWA SCHOOLHOUSE DAY BEFORE IT'S RAZING!



Shown above is the former Ottawa Schoolhouse, taken just before it was razed on June 23, 2011. The first property for the building was bought by the Rockcastle County Board of Education on December 24, 1885 from Jotham and Nancy Brown. An additional tract was obtained in August of 1929 from J.W. and Mary J. Brown. By the 1940s, it was a three room school housing Grades one through eight for many years before the eighth grade was moved to Brodhead Elementary School in 1954. Grades one through seven remained at the site for several more years. Gaffer Cash bought the property from the school board in 1958 and it was later sold to Walter and Reba Cash. Some of the teachers at the school over the years included: Rebecca Wallace, Della Scoggins, Willie J. Taylor, Henry and Rinda Brown, Mildra Randolph, Cecil McKinney, Margie Albright Brock, Margie Noe, Lamar Thompson, Willie Dillingham, Allbert Albright and Richard Harris.

Guidelines/procedures are now in place to better insure the safety of your child. We appreciate your cooperation and support.

Students who live in town can be walkers. Walkers will be dismissed at the southern end of the school which is where they have currently been exiting. The students are on their own to

walk home. A teacher will bring them out of the building however they are not required to put them in your custody. That will be your responsibility. If you live in town and do not want to walk home you will need to go through the car rider lines. All walkers will need to exit the building and go directly home.

Morning Drop Off: The students that are walkers or car riders should be dropped off at the front of the building. There will be an adult on duty to see that once the child leaves your custody he/she goes directly in the building. Students who plan on eating breakfast at school should arrive no later than 7:40 a.m. Parents will not be permitted to enter the hallways to meet with a teacher, cafeteria worker etc. between 7:30-8:00.
