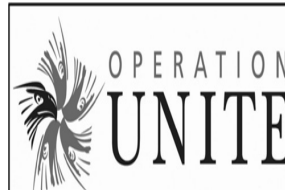

Each Bidder must accompany his Bid with a Bid Bond in amount of not less than five (5) percent of the base Bid. No Bidder may withdraw his Bid for a period of ninety (90) days. The Bidder awarded the Contract shall execute a 100% Performance Bond and a 100% Payment Bond and shall furnish insurance certification as required in the General Conditions. This Contract Work shall be completed within 90 calendar days following the start Work date ordered in the Notice to Proceed. Liquidated damages will be \$500 per calendar day. Bidders must comply with the President's Executive Order Nos. 11246 and 11375, which prohibit discrimination in employment regarding race, creed, color, sex, or national origin. Bidders must comply with Section 3, Section 109, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Anti-Kickback Act and the Contract Work Hours Standard Act.
