To spotlight the impact of national service and thank those who serve, mayors across the country participated in the first ever ‘Mayor’s Day of Recognition for National Service’ on April 9, 2013.

For nearly two decades the Corporation for National and Community Services (CNCS) has been working for America improving lives, strengthening communities and fos-

tering civic engagement through service and volunteering. The CNCS Programs, which includes the Kentucky Commission on Community Volunteerism & Service (KCCVS), AmeriCorps & Unite, tap the energy of our nation’s greatest resource the American people and focus it on pressing social problems.

Volunteers work across the country to tutor and

mentor youth, build affordable housing, teach computer skills, clean parks and streams, run after school programs or help communities respond to disasters and these are only a few of the services they provide.

As the federal agency for service and volunteering, CNCS annually engages more than four million citizens in service at 70,000 sites across the country. CNCS leverages federal and private funds to support organizations that achieve measureable results where the need is greatest.

Last year, CNCS leveraged more than 1 billion in investments for organizations operating or based in 500 cities with a population of at least 30,000. National service also plays a key role in many smaller cities, town and rural areas.

Southbound I-75 reduced to one lane

The Kentucky Department of Highways is reducing a portion of southbound I-75 to one lane between mile point 54 and mile point 61 as crews begin pavement improvements.

Each week until the project is complete, the southbound lanes will be reduced to one lane beginning at 6 p.m. Sunday until noon Thursday.

Work is scheduled to be completed by May 31st. The duration of work may be adjusted for inclement weather or other unforeseeable delays. Drivers should expect delays and are encouraged to allow extra time to reach their destinations.

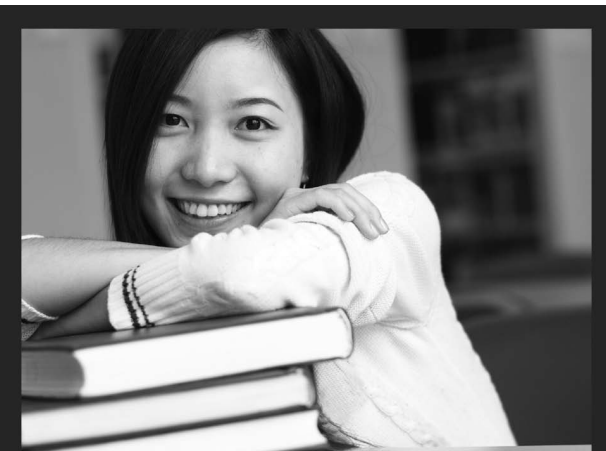
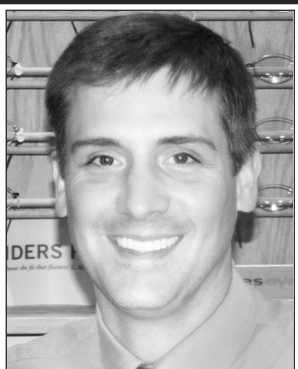
