

First Lady Jane Beshear officially declares Livingston a Kentucky Trail Town

Livingston will receive marketing assistance from the state since the city will now be highlighted as a Trail Town on state maps, websites, visitor's guides and other state promotion material.

Two people arrested for trafficking heroin

Two people were arrested for trafficking heroin Sunday afternoon after officers from the Rockcastle County Sheriff's Department and Mt. Vernon Police Department made a traffic stop on Freedom School Road in Mt.

Arrested at the scene was Lyndon Charles Coffey, 42, of Lexington and Wilma Gail Browning, 34, of Brodhead.

According to Mt. Vernon Police reports, Assistant Chief Barry Adams and Deputy Sheriff Matt Bryant made the traffic stop after observing that the driver of a red Chevrolet truck wasn't wearing his seatbelt and that he failed to use a turn signal when turning onto Freedom School Road from Christmas Tree Lane.

After receiving consent from Coffey to search the vehicle, officers found a folded up piece of paper containing suspected heroin in an off-white powder form. Officers also found a needle inside Browning's purse that appeared to be loaded with an unknown substance. Browning later told officers that the needle contained heroin.

Officers also found a plastic zip-lock bag in Coffey's left pants pocket that contained several hand-folded pieces of paper with each piece containing suspected heroin in powder form. Officers noticed that the pieces of paper were packaged in a way that is consistent with how illicit drugs in powder form are packaged for street sale.

After apprehending Coffey and Browning, officers searched their cell phones and found a text sent from Browning to Coffey stating "I got somebody wanting some h. u coming?" Officers also found various other text messages on Coffey's phone from several different people asking if they could buy some heroin.

Officers said Coffey's vehicle was displaying a license plate number that is registered to a 1995 white Ford vehicle under a Lexington woman's name. Officers later identified Coffey's license plate number in their system and discovered that his registration expired in March.

Coffey and Browning were charged with drug paraphernalia and trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree. Coffey was also separately charged with theft of a motor vehicle registration plate.

Both Coffey and Browning remain lodged in the Rockcastle County Detention Center on a \$10,000 cash/property bond.
