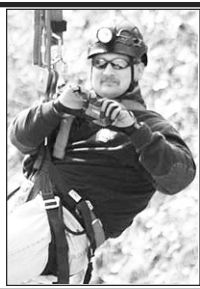
Last week I left you with this question. What are the goals that firefighters strive to achieve when fighting a fire? The answer, in order of priority, is personal safety, saving victims' lives, saving property, and protecting the environment. These goals not only apply to fires but every incident a firefighter responds.

What do you think being a firefighter means? How do you become a firefighter? These are a couple of questions I am going to try to cover this week. Let's start with becoming a firefighter. This can differ according to becoming a volunteer or a career firefighter. Many began their career by becoming a volunteer and later a career firefighter, which is how I began. Generally becoming a volunteer firefighter is not difficult however staying a volunteer can prove difficult.

Volunteer departments can differ on how they accept members but they are generally the same. At my volunteer department, Brodhead, we have a SOG or Standard Operating Guideline when it comes to accepting new members. First you need to attend one of our bi-monthly meetings. We meet the second Thursday and the fourth Monday. We ask you to tell us about yourself and why you are interested in joining the fire service. We want to make sure you are at least 18 years old before you join, any one between the age of 15 and 17 can join our junior firefighter program. After that you are asked to step outside so that we may discuss your membership. Once outside the members go into discuss about your

interest in the department and vote on your membership. When you return to the meeting room we inform you about your membership to the department. We almost always accept anyone who has the eagerness to join our department.

The first six months is your probationary period. During which time you cannot have lights and sirens in your vehicle, you cannot vote but your opinion is always welcome and your gear must remain at the station. We try to outfit everyone in gear if we have it available. Many volunteer fire departments are not as fortunate as Brodhead. Many departments' gear is scarce and only those who actively fight fires have gear and even then it may be outdated and unfit for service. Brodhead has been fortunate in receiving grants for gear and try to maintain serviceable gear for new members. Our probationary members are fitted for gear and are given a yellow helmet signifying they are on probation. These six months are used to evaluate their performance and activity within our department.

When you join, the training begins. Being a firefighter takes dedication, dedication to training. There is so much that you will need to learn about firefighting. Later I will go

more in depth into the training it takes to be a firefighter but for this week I will stick to a broad view. As a volunteer you will need to obtain 150 hours of training to become a certified volunteer or level 2 firefighter in the state of Kentucky. At my department we allow two years to achieve your certification. Once certified you have to maintain a minimum of 20 hours per year. Brodhead, however, asks our members to maintain 30 hours of training per year for firefighters and 40 hours per year for officers.

Finally, since most volunteers rely heavily on fundraisers to raise money for equipment and expenses, I need to mention Brodhead's annual fundraiser coming up next

week. You may know this as the Little World's Fair. Brodhead fire department has been doing the fair for several years now and your support has been most appreciated. Just so you know that half of the gate fee you pay goes towards the fire department with the other half used to pay for the fair company. We have two concession stands in the fairgrounds, the big stand by the concrete bleachers and the little stand at the end of the metal bleachers. All proceeds for these two concession stands go to the fire department with all the proceeds from the fair goes towards buying gear and equipment. So buying coming out and enjoying the fair, you support the fire department at the same time. Thank you very much in advance.

Next week I will discuss what it takes to become a career or paid firefighter. It varies with departments but I will go through the basics. This week's question is, how many hours does it take to become level 3 firefighter?

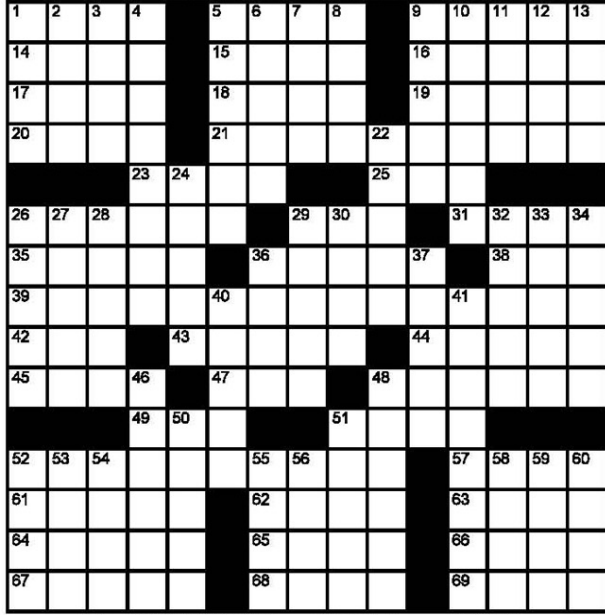
